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What is the National **Disability Insurance Scheme** (NDIS)?





The National Disability Insurance Scheme is also called the NDIS.

The NDIS is the new way of **funding** disability support.

The NDIS means you will receive your funding in a different way.



Your funding will be paid to you instead of service providers like Yooralla.



You will be able to choose which service provider you would like to use.

Your family and carers can help you choose if you want them to.



What is the National **Disability Insurance** Agency (NDIA)?



The National Disability Insurance Agency is also called the NDIA.



The NDIA has the job of making the NDIS work properly.



The NDIA can tell you

- how the NDIS will work and
- what help you can get.

What does the NDIS fund?







With the NDIS, you can get funding for

what you need every day

and

your goals.

Your goals are things that are important to you.







Your goals may be about

- where you live
- what you like to do
- where you want to go
- where you want to work

or

what you would like to learn.

The NDIS only funds support linked to your disability.





The NDIS does not fund daily costs like

- rent or board
- food

or

phone bills.

To get funding, you must create a plan.



What is an NDIS plan?

Everyone who accesses the NDIS will have to make a plan.



You will make your plan with a person chosen by the National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA).

This person may be called a planner or a Local Area Coordinator.





- talk to you about
 - o what you want and
 - o what you need.





- help you to
 - o set your goals

and

o choose the support that will go in your plan.



- support you to work together with your family and carers.
- tell you about services available in the community.




support you to develop a service agreement with your service provider.









- the support you need
- your goals

and

how much money you have to spend on these things.





Once your plan is finished, you can choose

• Who will provide your support This will be who you pay for services.



• When you will get your support For example during the day or at night.



Who will manage your funds. This could be you, a family member or someone you ask to do this for you.






How can I get ready to plan?

Before you meet with a planner you should think about

- what you get now
- what you want to do
- how these things will be put into your plan
- who you would like to
 - o help you prepare your plan and
 - o go to the meeting with you. You might choose a family member or advocate or group of people to help you.






- now

- to get a job if you would like one

Who can get the NDIS?

You have to be eligible to use the NDIS.



To get the NDIS you must

- live where the NDIS is available
- have a disability that means you need support for your lifetime

and

- need some help to do the things you want to do
- be an Australian citizen, or the law says you can stay in Australia

and

be under 65 years old.











To find out if you can get the NDIS you can also contact the NDIA.

When will the NDIS come to my area?

You cannot plan with the NDIS everywhere in Australia yet.



It will take some time for the NDIS to be everywhere in Australia.

Your funding will stay the same until your plan is approved with the NDIS.



In Victoria, the NDIS will be available by council area.



It will take three years until every area in Victoria has the NDIS.



Your support will transfer to the NDIS in these areas at times below.



These times were agreed by the government.

government to help you with the

things you need and want to do.

Service provider A company or business who has

staff that can help you with

things you need, like support

around the house or to get

around your local area.

Yooralla is a service provider.

Local Area A Local Area Coordinator is

work with you to create your

plan and connect you to the

community.

Service agreement

A document that says


- the service you want eg. help at home
- when you will receive your service eg. every morning
- Where you will receive your service will happen eg. at home or in the community
- the cost of the service and
- any other rules about using the service.

Advocate

People who tell

other people about

- what you need
- problems you have and
- your rights.



Australian citizen

Someone who is

- born in Australia
- moved to Australia and has paperwork to say they are Australian

or

has special paperwork to say that they can live in Australia.

Eligible

Having the right to do or receive something.

Council area

The local area where you live is looked after by your local council. Your council area may include many suburbs and towns.
