This factsheet is about the National Disability
Insurance Scheme and Early Childhood
Early Intervention.



The National Disability Insurance Scheme is called the NDIS.

The NDIS helps people under 65 with a disability get



care

supports.





Early intervention means to act on something early. It is also called ECEI.

ECEI may help your child get better.



ECEI helps children with a disability or **developmental delay** under 6.

Developmental delay means a child finds it hard to do everyday things. For example



 information about services in your local community




information about supports you can get

• help to make an NDIS plan if you need one.






The Early Childhood Partner will help your child be more **independent**.

learns to do everyday things




• joins community groups.
